Legacy of a Baptist Prophet

Baptists—and our nation—lost a major prophet this summer. James Dunn died on July 4, a fitting day for a farewell to such a champion of freedom of religion. Jim (Dr. James M Dunn) had been Executive Director of the Baptist Joint Committee for Religious Liberty from 1981 to 1999. An articulate and effective advocate, he was 83 years of age.

The present Executive, J. Brent Walker, has said, "I don't know anyone who fought harder to ensure religious freedom and to preserve the separation of church and state. He provided a consistent Baptist witness in public policy, and he leaves his fingerprints on national affairs and in the lives of many individuals. His tenure at the BJC saw the passage of such landmark legislation as the Equal Access Act and the Religious Freedom Restoration Act. After his retirement as Executive Director, he became a professor at the School of Divinity at Wake Forest University, where he had a profound impact on students."

When Jim spoke, you were compelled to listen. His speech was incisive, pithy, and epigramatic. Remembering him, I want to share these "quotes" from his addresses and writings:

- Religious freedom marks off the playing field, establishes the marketplace, provides the context in which all faiths may offer their own understanding of the ultimate good news from heaven to humankind.
- The best thing government can do for religion is to leave it alone.
- The trouble with a theocracy is everyone wants to be Theo!
- When government claims to aid all religions, it never fails to play favorites.
- Christians should be involved in politics, but with Christian goals, methods, attitudes and preparation. We should do our homework, speak out in a Christian tone of voice and be prepared to live with the consequences of joining the debate.
- Religious freedom and church-state separation are a package deal.
- You betcha boots. As long as there are math tests, there will be prayer in schools.
- Theocracy is organized arrogance.
- Since lobbying is simply "attempting to influence legislation," every Christian should be a lobbyist.
- "I don't know and I don't care" are twin threats to Christian citizenship.
- Churches faithful to the Gospel cannot remain silent in the face of injustice. Silence is sin.
- Stubbornness may be the most needed "gift of the Spirit."

Religious Leaders Issue Statement on Iran Agreement

A statement in support of the Iran Framework Agreement has been issued by the leaders of major American religious denominations, including ABC General Secretary, Roy Medley.

"We do this not as politicians," they say, "but as those whose deep faith commitments compel us to speak clearly, with moral and practical wisdom, about any possibility that restrains the threat of war and open pathways toward peace. Indeed, the One whose words and life we follow said, 'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the children of God."

Although the statement voices the convictions of these leaders, it is issued, in part to encourage members of congregations to weigh the issues involved and express their views to their representatives in Congress.
